

MISCHOLARSHIP TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Updated August 2026

Eligibility

Applicants must meet the eligibility requirements specified for the relevant MiScholarship category and any general eligibility criteria applying to the MiScholarship program.

Merit-based assessment

MiScholarships are awarded on merit. Meeting the eligibility criteria, submitting an application or being shortlisted does not create any entitlement or expectation that an applicant will receive a scholarship.

Maximum of one scholarship per category

A maximum of one scholarship may be awarded in each category in any scholarship year. MIGAS is not required to award a scholarship in every category and may determine that no applicant has demonstrated sufficient merit to receive an award.

Assessment and final decision

Applications will be assessed by an appointed MIGAS assessment panel against the applicable eligibility and selection criteria. The panel will make recommendations to the MIGAS Chief Executive Officer, who will make the final decision regarding scholarship recipients. All decisions are final and no review or appeal process applies.

Ongoing eligibility

Applicants must remain employed by MIGAS and continue to satisfy all relevant eligibility requirements at the application closing date. MIGAS may withdraw an application from consideration, or withdraw a scholarship offer before payment, where an applicant no longer satisfies those requirements.

Conduct and employment obligations

MIGAS may exclude an applicant or withdraw a scholarship offer where circumstances arise that, in MIGAS' opinion, affect the applicant's eligibility or suitability for the scholarship. This may include matters relating to conduct, employment obligations, training progress, qualification requirements or compliance with MIGAS policies and procedures.

Application information and verification

Applicants are responsible for ensuring that information provided in their application is accurate and complete. MIGAS may verify information contained in an application, including by contacting host employers, supervisors, trainers, Field Officers or other relevant parties. MIGAS may exclude an application or withdraw an award where information is false, misleading, materially incomplete or cannot reasonably be verified.

Late or incomplete applications

MIGAS may decline to consider applications received after the closing date or applications that are incomplete. MIGAS may, at its discretion, accept a late or incomplete application in exceptional circumstances.

Equal merit

Where two or more applicants are assessed as being of substantially equal merit, MIGAS may determine the successful applicant or, at its discretion, divide the scholarship between those applicants. MIGAS is not required to increase the total value allocated to the category.

Scholarship payment

Unless otherwise specified for a particular category, the scholarship will be paid directly to the successful recipient. Any information provided by an applicant about their intended use of the scholarship funds may be considered as part of the assessment but does not restrict the recipient's use of the funds after payment.

Program discretion

MIGAS may, at its discretion and at any time, amend, suspend, withdraw or cancel the MiScholarship program or any individual scholarship category. This includes the right to change scholarship values, eligibility requirements, assessment criteria, application or closing dates, assessment arrangements or other program conditions, including after applications have opened.

Publicity

By accepting a MiScholarship, the successful recipient agrees that MIGAS may publish their name, photograph, host employer, scholarship category and reasonable information about their apprenticeship, achievements and scholarship story for internal and external communication and promotional purposes.

General discretion

MIGAS retains discretion in the administration and interpretation of the MiScholarship program and these terms and conditions, subject to applicable law.
